Medical Emergencies in the Dental Office (Are You Ready?)

This interactive session will review common and/or important medical emergencies in the dental office. Our discussion will range from common causes of medical issues to uncommon threats to patient safety to how to organize your emergency kits using scenarios for clinical context. A dental practice will encounter a medical emergency once every 18 months. Are you ready?
